

### Percent Population Change of Neighboring Counties










### Population Growth by Age Group Marion County (2020-2030)









### Family Type with Children






Land Value History for State Of Iowa (1951-2023)














#### Marion County, IA vs US, Growth in Firms-All Sizes & Industries, 2012-2022













#### Mid-Iowa Planning Alliance, Employment by County, Total % Growth, 2012-2022





#### Mid-Iowa Planning Alliance, Employment by County, Net New Jobs, 2012-2022










Personal Income: Percent Change at Annual Rate, 2024:Q2–2024:Q3


#### Marion County, IA vs US, Annual Salary Growth-All Industries, 2012-2022













By county; Estimate as of July of each year




## Iowa #27 in US for Population growth (2020-2023)






#### Marion County Total Demand by Submarket, 2024-2035




#### Median Resale Price by Submarket, 2023










