WELCOME & INTRODUCTIONS.

A planning meeting of the Marion County Development Commission was called to order by Chair, David Vollmar, at 7:15 a.m., Wednesday, October 13, 2021 at 3014 East Main Street, Knoxville, Iowa.

ACTION ITEMS:

- 1. A motion was made (Weiler Green/Bonnstetter) to approve the September minutes. Motion carried.
- 2. A motion was made (Bonstetter/Kniff McCulla) to approve the July and August financial report. Motion carried.

DISCUSSION ITEMS:

1. Broadband

- a. The report from HR Green and the Greater DSM Partnership is not yet finished. It was originally scheduled to be completed in early September.
- **b.** The next round of broadband funding has grant applications due November 22.
- c. Commissioners discussed the next step in the county is to hold a broadband stakeholder meeting to review the report and dashboard data. The new Economic Development District (EDD) called Mid-Iowa Planning Alliance (MIPA) should be able to help the area with grant applications once the data is available.

2. Business Attraction

- a. Targeted Industry Cut Sheets and a Regional Profile have been completed and placed on the new economic development website.
- **b.** There were 4 targeted industries recommended. Commissioners discussed capacity to target 4 different sectors as well as funding needed for marketing. Commissioners also discussed how to best manage lead generations and flow of information between local EDO's and MCDC.
- c. The next step identified is to schedule a meeting with the local EDO's to discuss marketing, lead generation management and response protocol. The commissioners felt focusing on two of the 4 targeted sectors to begin with would allow for a quality effort to be implemented.

EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR UPDATES:

- 1. The next Quarterly Economic Development CONNECT meeting will be held October 29. This will be an in-person meeting at Weiler Corporation focusing on legislative issues for the upcoming lowa Legislative Session.
- 2. Eysink continues to meet with local chamber, economic development, and community college representatives to discuss the ideas of a pitch event and succession planning focus. They discussed doing a pitch event where round one would be videos and round 2 would be a live event that would match up entrepreneurs with potential investors. The entrepreneurs prior to round 2 would be given some assistance from coaches to help develop their pitch. The partners also discussed putting together a 1-hour video that would overview succession planning, potential hire consultants to provide some one-on-one appointments with companies and compile a workbook to help companies with succession planning. The partners are meeting to discuss these ideas further after some research on the topics.
- 3. Leadership Red Rock applications are due this month. The first session is scheduled for November 16.
- 4. Best of Red Rock voting ends November 1.
- 5. Top 10 Under 40 nominations are being accepted until January 31.

REGIONAL REPORTS:

- 1. The application for the Economic Development District (EDD) has been submitted. Approval is expected from EDA in the first quarter of 2022.
- 2. Eysink met with leaders working on the Transload Rail project in Des Moines that could potentially benefit area businesses.
